ON A VOLUNTEER BASIS, JAY & HIS WELL BALANCED PACK ARE MAKING TIME AVAILABLE TO HART AND PAWS TO PROVIDE BEHAVIOURAL ASSESSMENTS.

These 'personality' assessments provide HART the advantages needed for suitable placement, matching the dogs individual needs with those of the family who will care for him/her.

Serving Haliburton and region at large, Jays operates a DOG WELLNESS CENTER, 705-455-9395. His specialty is the rehabilitation of the psychologically damaged dog. Dogs suffering behavioural issues, often subsequent to a lack of leadership skill, can be restored. Even dogs seriously 'scarred' with issues of aggression, neglect and abuse, can be rehabilitated to well behaved individuals, given appropriate guidance. Jay has been proving this for years. HART DOES NOTHING FOR CATS??? HART BEGS TO DIFFER!!!

IN 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009 A SMALL HANDFUL OF VOLUNTEERS CALLED HART, worked to administer and pay for a total of \$53,615.00 in subsidized vet care. 1075 cats and dogs were spayed/neutered/vaccinated in 13 regional municipalities. 70% of these funds were spent directly on cats, therefore prohibiting the births of thousands of homeless animals.

IN 2006 ~ 2009, A TOTAL OF \$8,950. WAS DONATED BY ONLY 5 OF 13 MUNICIPALITIES served by this HART program. This figure includes \$3500. donated by the Faraday Pound Board, over 3 years. Hastings Highlands a forward thinking council, has been the leader with annualized support of SNIP, over 3 years, totaling \$3000. of the above figure.

HART CANNOT DO EVERYTHING, BUT WE DO EVERYTHING WE CAN in the face of enormous challenges to meet the needs of suffering animals here. The above figures represent only the cost to subsidize through SNIP, HART's secondary program. These figures are 'dwarfed' by the annual cost to rescue, rehabilitate and find acceptable adoptive placements for the regions dogs, HART's primary program. HART has also subsidized the spay/neuter costs of Trap/Neuter/Release cat 'colonies' and continues to do so, for those willing to caretake the colony. HART also routinely supplies food, at no cost, to people caring for and feeding cat colonies. HART also continues to provide emergency vet care, to badly injured or sick, stray animals.
